### **Projects Recommended to Pursue Infrastructure Fund Assistance:**

## **Belmont, City of Sys Imprvs (New application)**

2023S-2400

Kathy Emery described the request, and it is technically feasible.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the City of Belmont pursue a \$1,500,000 CWSRF Principal Forgiveness Loan, a \$1,670,000 CWSRF Loan (0.75%, 30 yrs., 0.25% AF), and a \$500,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$3,670,000.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

### Elizabeth, Town of – Sys Imprvs (New application)

2023S-2370

Kathy Emery described the request, and it is technically feasible.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of Elizabeth pursue a \$1,700,000 CWSRF Principal Forgiveness Loan, and a \$1,000,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$2,700,000.

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Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

## Hancock County PSD-Newell I (Cost & funding change)

Wayne Morgan described the request.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Hancock County PSD pursue a \$1,500,000 CWSRF Principal Forgiveness Loan, a \$500,000 CWSRF Green Forgiveness Loan, a \$2,169,279 CWSRF Loan (1.75%, 30 yrs., 0.25% AF), a \$1,411,079 WDA EEGF, a \$50,000 Hancock County Commission Grant, a \$5,000,000 IJDC Distressed Utility Grant, and a \$500,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$11,130,358.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

### Masontown, Town of-Herring Rd Line Repl (New application)

Meredith Vance described the request, and it is technically feasible.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of Masontown pursue a \$900,000 US ACE Grant and a \$300,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$1,200,000.

## Northern Jackson County PSD-Dist Sys Imprvs (Cost and funding change)

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends Northern Jackson County PSD pursue a \$1,500,000 US ACE Grant, a \$387,000 WDA EEGF, a \$133,000 Jackson County Commission ARPA Grant, and a \$500,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$2,520,000.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

### Rowlesburg, City of – Sys Imprvs (New application)

The Technical Review and Funding committee recommends the City of Rowlesburg pursue a \$7,578,000 CDS Grant, a \$1,895,000 CDS Match Grant, a \$1,177,000 CWSRF Principal Forgiveness, and a \$500,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated cost of \$11,150,000.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of Sophia pursue a \$3,000,000 CWSRF Loan (0.25%, 40 yrs., 0.25% AF), a \$2,000,000 CWSRF Debt Forgiveness Loan, a \$1,000,000 USDA Loan (2.875%, 40 yrs.), a \$1,000,000 USDA Grant, a \$8,000,000 WDA EEGF, and a \$1,000,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$16,000,000.

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Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Southern Jackson Co PSD-Statts Mills Ext, 35 cust (Cost and funding change) 2022W-2291 Wayne Morgan described the request.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends Southern Jackson County PSD pursue a \$1,300,000 US ACE Grant, a \$416,000 WDA EEGF, and a \$434,000 IJDC Loan (3%, 20 yrs.) for an estimated project cost of \$2,150,000.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Matt McComas seconded the motion. The motion passed.

### West Union, Town of -WTP & Sys Improvs (Updated application)

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of West Union pursue a \$17,420,000 DWTRF Loan (0.5% requested, 40 yrs., 0.25% AF), a \$1,000,000 DWTRF Principal Forgiveness, a \$600,000 DWTRF Emerging Contaminant PFL, a \$3,000,000 WDA EEGF, a \$500,000 Doddridge County ARPA Grant, A \$500,000 Doddridge County Commission Grant, \$80,000 Town ARPA Grant, and a \$1,000,000 IJDC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$24,100,000.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the City of Belmont pursue a \$1,050,000 DWTRF Loan (1%, 40 yrs., 0.25% AF), a \$1,000,000 DWTRF Principal Forgiveness, a \$100,000 Pleasants County Commission Grant, a \$100,000 of City ARPA Grant, and a \$1,450,000 WDA EEGF for an estimated project cost of \$3,700,000.

Newburg, Town of-Sys Imprvs (Scope cost and funding chg/eng fee variance)

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of Newburg pursue a \$1,650,000 US

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ACE Grant, a \$1,500,000 CWSRF Debt Forgiveness, a \$1,000,000 WDA EEGF, and a \$125,000 Preston County ARPA Grant for an estimated project cost of \$4,275,000. The Town of Newburg request for a total engineering fee variance is approved.

## **RMS PSD Glen Rogers Sys Imprvs (New application)**

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Ravencliff McGraws Saulsville (RMS) PSD pursue a \$4,400,000 DEP AMLER Grant, a \$1,500,000 CWSRF Principal Forgiveness Loan, and a \$1,931,000 ARC Grant for an estimated project cost of \$7,831,000.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

South Charleston, City of WWTP Electrical Dist Sys Repl (New application)

Kathy Emery described the request, and it is technically feasible.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the City of South Charleston pursue a \$3,960,000 CWSRF Loan (2.75%, 20 yrs., 0.25% AF) and a \$1,000,000 WDA EEGF for an estimated project cost of \$4,960,000.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Barrackville, Town of-Sys Imprvs (Funding change and binding commitment repl) 2021S-1972 Wayne Morgan described the request.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Town of Barrackville pursue a \$500,000 IJDC Grant and a \$2,075,000 IJDC Loan (2%, 30 yrs.) for an estimated project cost of \$2,575,000; and receive a \$500,000 IJDC Grant and \$2,075,000 IJDC Loan (2%, 30 yrs.) binding commitment replacing its existing binding commitment.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

## Cowen PSD-Upper Glade II (Bid overrun/binding commitment) 2014S-1515

Wayne Morgan described the request.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Cowen PSD pursue a \$1,950,000 USDA Loan (2.375%, 38 yrs.), a \$500,000 USDA Loan (1.25%, 38 yrs.), a \$2,450,000 USDA Grant, a \$1,500,000 ARC Grant, a \$2,595,050 WDA EEGF, a \$1,069,303 WDA EEGF Bid Overrun Grant, a \$1,000,000 IJDC Grant and a \$165,000 IJDC Bid Overrun Grant for an estimated project cost of \$11,229,353 (\$400,000 WDA funding for design to be paid off at closing); and receive a binding commitment for the \$165,000 IJDC Bid Overrun Grant.

## Mt Hope Water Assoc-Dist Sys Imprvs (Binding commitment) 2023W-2372

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Mt Hope Water Association receive a \$1,408,000 IJDC Loan (3%, 20 yrs.) binding commitment.

## Pea Ridge PSD-Rt 2 Part 1 (Bid overrun/binding commitment) 2022S-2294

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Pea Ridge PSD pursue a \$7,411,801 CWSRF Loan (1.75%, 30 yrs., 0.25% AF), a \$1,500,000 CWSRF Debt Forgiveness, a \$500,000 CWSRF Debt (green) Forgiveness, a \$2,500,000 US EDA Grant, a \$4,312,000 WDA EEGF, a \$500,000 IJDC Grant and a \$165,000 IJDC Bid Overrun Grant for an estimated project cost of \$16,888,801; and receive a binding commitment for the \$165,000 IJDC Bid Overrun Grant.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

# Pennsboro, City of – CN Rt 74 N. 30 cust (Binding commitment extension) 2022W-2128 Wayne Morgan described the request.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the City of Pennsboro receive a binding commitment extension until January 15, 2024.

Marie Prezioso moved that the recommendation be approved, Virginia King seconded the motion. The motion passed.

# Webster Springs PSD -Sys Improvs (Binding commitment extension) 2019S-1812 Wayne Morgan described the request.

The Technical Review and Funding Committee recommends the Webster Springs PSD pursue a \$1,500,000 CDBG, a \$500,000 IJDC Grant and a \$1,310,500 IJDC Loan (2%, 30 yrs.) for an estimated cost of \$3,310,500; and replace its existing binding commitment with a \$500,000 IJDC Grant and \$1,310,500 IJDC Loan (2%, 30 yrs.)

## New River Gorge RDA - Carbon Activated (Loan modification)

2019E-183

Kris Warner described the request.

RE: New River Regional Development Authority is requesting an extension of the performance period for the Carbon Activated Project in Mount Hope, WV. The loan was approved in June 2019 and the company experienced pandemic related delays in implementing the project. They will begin hiring at the facility this year.

### **MOTION:**

I MOVE THAT the loan to the New River Regional Development Authority (2019E-183) for Carbon Activated in Mount Hope, WV have the performance period extended until June 2025. All other terms and conditions will remain the same as previously approved, **BE APPROVED**

## **Benedum Airport Authority – Hangar (Loan modification)**

2021E-198

Kris Warner described the request.

RE: Benedum Airport Authority is requesting to convert loan 2021E-198 from a loan to a grant. The loan was originally approved in June 2021 for the construction of a hangar at the North Central Regional Airport in Bridgeport to be occupied by Mitsubishi Heavy Industries. The hangar is complete and Mitsubishi Heavy Industries has created over 100 new jobs and retained over 400 jobs. Thus, the performance requirements for the reduction of the principal balance to \$0 have been satisfied by the Authority prior to the loan being funded. The change from loan to a grant will greatly reduce closing costs associated with this transaction. The building will remain publicly owned and in operation as a hangar in perpetuity, and the company has performed as promised.

### **MOTION:**

I MOVE THAT the loan to the Benedum Airport Authority (2021E-198) be converted to a grant.

This change will be subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Submission of \$2 million or more invoices associated with the construction of the hangars in question and evidence that such invoices have been paid.
- 2. Written proof that Authority/company project of constructing and equipping hangars has met the stated goal of approximately \$16 million in capital investment in the project.
- 3. Submission of the executed lease between the Benedum Airport Authority or its affiliates and MHI for operation of the facility as a hangar.
- 4. Certification that a minimum of 500 people are employed by MHI at the Bridgeport facility, **BE**APPROVED

Kris Warner moved that the recommendation be approved, Matt McComas seconded the motion. The motion passed.
